## The Importance of Self-Care

You have stepped in to nurture, guide and care for one or more children, a daunting responsibility even in the best of circumstances. What you are doing is a wonderful thing, although it may not always feel like it.

Being a caregiver is stressful. There are schedules to juggle, appointments to make and keep, school events. Having more people in the home adds to the cooking, cleaning, laundry, and other household tasks. Trying to fit it all in may lead to poor eating habits, not getting enough rest, and not taking care of your own health. About half of family caregivers suffer from clinical depression.

Taking care of yourself isn't selfish - it's smart. The healthier you are, both physically and emotionally, the better you are able to take care of someone else. That's why it's important to carve out some "me time" every day, even if it's just a few minutes. Some possibilities are:

- ☆ Meeting a friend for coffee
- ☆ Meditation, deep breathing, or prayer
- ☆ Taking a walk
- ☆ Pleasure reading
- ☆ Buying yourself a small treat
- ☆ Listening to some favorite songs

Even just a few minutes a day can help both emotionally and physically. But what if it's not enough? That's when it's time to seek outside help - making and keeping a doctor's visit for *you* where you talk about your challenges, for example. Consider counseling, or a support group. #### ?? FAFSA ??

If you have a teenager about to graduate from high school, you may have heard of the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). This form helps a student get financial aid - federal grants, federal loans, and work-study programs. Many colleges also use it in determining their assistance packages.

A child who lives with a legal guardian is considered an independent student on the FAFSA. That means that your income is not included on the form.

#### Spring Shredding Event

The Council is holding its Spring Drive-By Shredding Event on **Saturday**, **April 1st**, **9am to Noon** at the Xenia Community Center (1265 W Second St, next to the Council office). No reservations required. Drive up with up to 3 bags or boxes of documents. Volunteers will move them from your car to the Shred-it truck.

Please be sure that the bags/boxes only contain paper—no checkbook covers or binder clips, for example.

Papers that need to be shredded include old tax documents, and old credit card or bank statements. Instruction booklets, envelopes, and junk mail should be recycled.



#### **KPI Review**

Ohio's *Kinship Permanency Program*, or KPI, is intended to provide initial financial support for minor children who are being cared for in a kinship situation. Funds include an initial larger payment, followed by a series of smaller payments at 6 month intervals, up to a total of 8 payments.

There is no deadline for the initial application.

#### Eligibility requirements:

- A court-issued order granting legal custody or on or after July 1, 2005. Temporary or informal
  guardianship is not sufficient.
- The child must live with the kinship caregiver.
- Everyone 18 years or older in the home must complete a background check.
- If the placement was not made by an approved children services agency, the kinship family must undergo a
  home study (at no cost) prior to KPI approval.
- The gross income of the household cannot exceed 300% of federal poverty guidelines.
